1	PROCEEDINGS
2	(Recording of the meeting began at 3:35 p.m.)
3	MR. BAGNER: Thank you everyone for coming a half
4	an hour early before the Board meeting. We are here
5	to discuss a few things. The first and primary agenda
6	item is to talk about next elections. So it seems
7	like we just did elections and that is the case
8	primarily because most all the people actually on the
9	durrent slate of officers were elected because people
10	had left or turned out. We're up for new elections
11	because we've had by the statute required and
12	everyone has a copy of the statute at their seats.
13	'm sorry, the bylaws, not the statute. So everyone
14	has a copy of that.
15	And so every two years before the April Board
16	meeting we have to elect the four positions, the board
17	chair, vice chair, treasurer and secretary. We did
18	that within the past two years several times because
19	people turned out, as folks remember. And so we are
20	here again now to and what we did, if folks
21	remember, or probably won't remember, but last April
22	we ended up recommending, unanimously approving
23	Nomination Committee, and then the Board, that we
24	extended folks current year through April 2020 because
25	otherwise some folks would have been in their position

   for just a few months. It wouldn't make sense.

       So here we are now getting ready for election of
3
   the new, of the slate of all those positions. And we
   have to, as a committee, approve to move forward for
5
   Jim to be able to send an email to request for folks
   interested in serving in those positions. So that's
   the main reason we're here.

       A few clarifying points, Ken, who is here,
   thought he was going to be terming out. It turns out,
10
    in terms of the statute, and this applies for most of
11
    us actually, except for the at-large positions, that
12
    you do not term out necessarily if the times we
13
    thought folks would term out. So Ken is eligible to
14
    continue to serve if he is interested as well as
15
    anyone else. We'll leave it there for a minute and
16
    see if folks have questions or comments.
17
       MS. LEICHTER: So with everyone else on the
18
    current -- or whatever, the officers, we --
19
       MR. BAGNER: Continue to serve?
20
       MS. LEICHTER: Yeah, we could have the same slate
21
     right now technically if we wanted to. The four
22
    current officers.
23
       MR. BAGNER: Yes. Can we get clarification on --
24
       MS. LEICHTER: Like is anyone else terming out
25
    br?

      MR. HOFFMAN: Steve's term as an at-large member
   is terming out. I don't know if its --

      MR. ALI: He has a year and nine months more.

      MR. HOFFMAN: Oh, he does, okay.

      MR. BAGNER: Oh, so it would be almost the full,

   dose to the full years. Total two years.

      MS. LEICHTER: I know Karen is through an agency.
   And Mark's through an agency. You just said that
   those don't really term out.

       MR. BAGNER: Right.

       MS. LEICHTER: So then Steve would be our own
12
    terming, I guess, if we --

       MR. BAGNER: It will be for more than half the
14
    hext term. So I'm hearing folks interested in keeping
15
    the slate. We have two members of the slate here.

       Is that something that you're both interested in
17
    to serve? Within a very short time as well.
18
       MR. HAJ: But what I believe, we still have to
19
    send out the requests, who is interested.

       MR. BAGNER: Yes.
       MS. FERRADAZ: Or if anyone wants to nominate

    like you said, if others have the desire of being in

   there was more than one candidate per position, we
   would have an election.

       MS. LEICHTER: And just to refresh, we vote here
11
    and we submit a slate to the Board and then the Board
12
    passes the slate, correct?
13
       MR. BAGNER: Correct. And that leads to the next
14
    discussion, which is the timeline, which everyone has
15
    there in front of them. And not just that we elect as
16
    a committee, but we'll also conduct interviews. If
17
    you remember, we did that in previous times as well,
18
    so we're meeting today, assuming we as a committee
19
    approve us to move forward, then Jim will send out the
20
    email as early as next week. And then giving folks
21
    time over the holidays and up until the beginning of
22
    January to submit their application if they're
23
    Interested in serving in any of those positions. And
24
    then the plan for us would be to review candidates at
25
    the end of January and then interview candidates in

      So just looking at those dates, are those dates
   for this committee that seem to work for folks? I
   know it is around Presidents', that week around the

    Tuesday. Folks need to be here anyway.

      MS. LEICHTER: I was going to ask you, when is
10
    the Trust meeting in January?

       MR. BAGNER: The 21st.
12
       MS. LEICTHER: It's also on that same day?
13
       MR. BAGNER: Yeah.
14
       MS. LEICHTER: Okay.
15
       MR. BAGNER: So that would be when we meet to
16
    discuss the applications.
17
       MS. LEICHTER: Yeah, I think it's good to meet
18
    before.
19
       MR. BAGNER: Does that work for everyone?
20
       MS. DONWORTH: I think it's fine. So the
21
    advertisement runs for a week?
22
       MR. ALI: January 9th.
23
       MS. DONWORTH: So it's open starting and then

      MS. NEIMAND: Its February 18th.
3
      MR. BAGNER: Right. It says week of February
4
    17th, but the meeting, we were thinking, would be on
5
   Hebruary 18th right -- similar what we're doing today,
   right before the Board meeting. Folks have to be here
   anyway. And the same would be in January, on January
   21st, we would meet to review the candidates before
9 the Board meeting.

       MS. LEICHTER: Are we going to make incumbents
11
    Interview?
12
       MR. BAGNER: I think that's up to us unless -- is
13
    there something in the statute that requires us to
14
    Interview?
15
       MS. GRAVES: Nothing is in the statute --
16
       MS. LEICHTER: We started that like a few years
17
    ago.
18
       MR. BAGNER: We did, yeah. So we can decide that
19
    later on once we --
20
       MR. HOFFMAN: It wasn't a question of incumbents
21
    because I know that, for example, Mark had interviewed
22
    and he was the only candidate for vice chair and I
23
    interviewed when I was the only candidate for chair,
24
    which is fine. I think it was probably helpful for
25
    the committee. But I think we need to also look at
```

1 the time because if you're going to do this before a Board meeting, arguably you might have four candidates 3 dr more, since conceivably people should self-select and say I'd like to be finance or chair or vice chair 5 dr whatever. So it might be a strain on the committee to try to do it that day when you already have two hours of Board meeting, up to two hours of Board meeting scheduled. So it's just a thought. 9 MR. BAGNER: We can have this discussion once we 10 review the applications, but I don't think we have to 11 make any decisions now. We may change our mind 12 depending on who is interested. If there's more 13 people interested than who's on the slate, then maybe 14 that might lead to a different discussion. 15 MR. HOFFMAN: But the only firm date here then is 16 January 21st. 17 MR. BAGNER: Right. Nothing is established until 18 as a group we -- so we can firm up the January 21st 19 meeting. As we get closer, after the applications are submitted, we can get a feel for how many are 20 21 submitted and that might dictate how long of a 22 meeting. But thinking however long we need, we will 23 just do right before the January 21st meeting. And 24 then I'll be in touch with Muriel to send out invites 25 and how long we need.

      MR. HOFFMAN: Sorry, the Board meeting is on

   January 21st?

      MR. BAGNER: Correct.

      Any other questions?
5
      Okay, well I think we need a motion to -- and
   then we have one more item to discuss, but a motion to
   approve, allow Jim to send out the email to request
   applications for the slate of offices.

      MS. FERRADAZ: The timeline, do we have to
10
    approve that?
11
       MS. GRAVES: We can use the motion to accept the
12
    timeline and then authorize the CEO to do the
13
    advertisement and any other actions related to the
14
    homination process.
15
       MR. BAGNER: Sure. Altogether or separate?
16
       MS. GRAVES: Yeah, you can do --
17
       MR. BAGNER: Altogether, okay. So is there a
18
    motion to give Jim the authorization to send out an
19
    email to request for applications for the slate of
    officers and the timeline that I moved for it?
20
21
       MR. PRESCOTT: So moved.
22
       MS. NEIMAND: Second.
23
       MR. BAGNER: Any recusals?
24
       All of those in favor?
25
       (WHEREUPON, the committee members all responded

       MR. BAGNER: Any opposed?
3
       The motion passes.
4
       So to our other item, this is something with less
5
   time urgency, but in the statute we have a 33 board
   rhember, but for a while we only had 32 members. And
   that is because of a local alliance.
8
       What was the name of the organization?
9
       MR. ALI: Alliance for Human Services.
10
       MR. BAGNER: Alliance for Human Services that no
11
    longer exists. So the question for us is, as a
12
    committee, do we want to consider potentially
13
    replacing that position with another position that we
14
    can consider, or we can consider just having a 32
15
    member board.
16
       MS. GRAVES: So after the Alliance no longer
17
    existed, it was still written in the county ordinance
18
    and that's why that petition wasn't there. Last year,
19
     believe it was last year, we amended the ordinance
20
    and we applied the language in the ordinance to that
21
    of a statute, which is the -- what you have here now,
22
    the mobile alliance or coalition engagement process of
23
    planning. And so that position now is identified in
24
    your ordinance and so you need to fill that position.
25
    You shouldn't leave it blank as with all the other
```

   dositions on the board. It's just a determination of
2
   which organization will fill that spot.
3
       MR. BAGNER: Okay. I was under the impression
4 that we could choose not to.
5
       MR. HAJ: If we choose not to, we had talked
6
   about amending the statute to strike through it.
7
       MS. GRAVES: You would have to amend the
   drdinance, and I don't think -- we would have to
   discuss it because it's in the statute and so the
10
    statute would govern. And so even if you would try to
11
    strike it out of the ordinance, it's still --
12
       MR. HOFFMAN: That's what Jim just said, to amend
13
    the statute.
14
       MR. HAJ: Can you just give some, just for
15
    historical knowledge, about the alliance seat?
16
       MR. ALI: Back in 2002 the Alliance for Human
17
    Services was created. All of the funding came from
18
    The Board of County Commissioners with the
19
    discretionary funding. They elected or appointed or
20
    hired an executive director. They had about a 15
21
    member board from various organizations. So it really
22
    was cross-system health and social services. They had
23
    developed social services plan that guided them how to
24
    solicit services. And they basically did what we do
25
    fight now, they got the money from the tax, the BCC,
```

1 and then they solicit it, and then enter the 2 dontracts. As time went on, I think the commissioners 3 were not too happy with the process. And then around 4 2010, mid-2010, they did away with the Alliance for 5 Human Services. At that point, they had Mark. So Evah Torres, who used to sit on the board, he was the Alliance for Human Services, a party on our board. 8 When they dissolved that, the ELC appointed him to 9 remain on the board from the ELC. But because of 10 that, that's where it ended up being and we had no 11 Alliance for Human Services and the seat had been 12 vacant. And as Shanika said, about a year, year and a 13 half ago, the statute was changed and then the 14 prdinance was changed. But as Jim and I were saying, 15 the alliance really fit the role at that point because 16 It had the social services master plan. It did 17 health, it did social services, broad spectrum. So 18 how with this five or six agencies we've explored, 19 hone of them really fit the bill to do that kind of function. So I think that's why Jim suggested we had 20 21 o look at changing the name or deleting it or 22 whatever it might be. 23 MR. HAJ: And there are five names that should be 24 in front of you, five or six names that we've explored 25 over the last year that can possibly do it. So I just

       MR. PRESCOTT: I just need to make sure I
   understand. The statute mandated this organization to
5
   ble a part of The Children's Trust. The Charter also
   mandated it to be a part of The Children's Trust. The
   Charter was consistent with the statute. What has
8
   dhanged? Was it the statute or the ordinance?
9
       MS. GRAVES: No, the statute was -- the statute
    was the same. The ordinance made it more specific.
11
    So when we add the alliance when it existed, the
12
    prdinance just specifically identified the alliance to
13
    fit that position.
14
       MR. PRESCOTT: The statute didn't call for the
15
    alliance, it called for an entity consistent with the
16
    alliance?
17
       MS. GRAVES: Yes.
18
       MR. PRESCOTT: So now we're trying to find
19
    another entity consistent with that? Okay, thank you.
20
       MR. HOFFMAN: Judge, and Shanika, I think you'll
21
    agree, it was a purpose filled position in the statute
22
    because the 33 member board was directed to either
23
    specific agencies. Like the agency that I served
24
    under the pleasure of was MCCJ, a faith-based
25
    prganization. This was built for that agency at the
```

1 time. That agency no longer exists and the county drdinance was adopted to take the statutory language, 3 which was built through that agency. We can't change 4 that without changing the statute. 5 MS. GRAVES: Well, I don't know the history dehind the statutory instruction, but I do agree that the county specifically identified that to fit based 8 dn the statute. 9 MR. HOFFMAN: I think my understanding of the 10 history and also what Imran just added, is that it 11 really was built for that entity that existed at the 12 time. Sort of a not in the wink of the statute and 13 alliance that does this and it happened to be that 14 bne. 15 MS. GRAVES: The only suggestion that I would 16 have is if the route that you all decide to take is a 17 statutory amendment, is until the statute is amended, 18 that we should, if possible, fill that position now 19 that its included in the ordinance. 20 MS. DONWORTH: How difficult is it to change the 21 statute? 22 MR. BAGNER: We'd have to explore that with our 23 legislatures. 24 MS. DONWORTH: The only one here to me that would 25 come close, just from a data standpoint, is the Health

   Council of South Florida. But none of the others to
   the would fit sort of that overarching planning entity
3
   in the realm of sort of a broad array of health and
4
   docial services.

       MS. FERRADAZ: What were the five that you said
6
   you had explored?
7
       Do you have any other information about the
   drganizations --
9
       MR. HAJ: Those five, no. This was just to bring
10
    It here. We can bring it back next Nominating
11
    Committee meeting. It's just to open up the
12
    discussion.
13
       MS. GRAVES: And then I also just tack on, as far
    as the legislature processes, most of the bills, I
15
    know in the house they have a limited number of bills.
16
    Bill filing has already been done. And so this would
17
    have to be tacked on to something that's already
18
    existing, and then as Jim said, to look in speaking
19
    with the members of the legislature to determine how
20
    workable it would be to kind of tack this on.
21
       MR. BAGNER: So we're looking at the early of
22
    hext year for changing the statute and then we would
23
    have to change the ordinance, assuming that for the
24
    improvements that we're talking about. That would
25
    take some time.

       When was the last time we had this position
2
   filled?
3
       MR. HAJ: Nine years.
4
       MR. BAGNER: So it's been nine years. And you're
5
   recommending we fill that position temporarily?
6
       MS. GRAVES: Based on -- because the Board will
   have to decide the action they want to direct Jim into
   taking, if they want the bill to be amended to remove
   that position or not. And so since we have -- the
10
    only reason the position wasn't there was after the
11
    Alliance no longer existed, there was no entity to put
12
    in that would fill the ordinance. And now we don't
13
    have that block anymore and so because we can do it,
14
    we suggest that the Board just fill it and to be true
15
    to what the statute and the ordinance require.
16
       MS. FERRADAZ: But even with this description, I
17
    don't know that any of these agencies are broad enough
18
    across -- it says health and social services. I'm
19
    just looking at the list, one is more mental health,
20
    another one is housing. I don't see the --
21
       MS. GRAVES: I don't know about these
22
    prganizations. I can just say, generally, like I'm
23
    involved with the county's Opioid Task Force Addiction
24
    Services Board, and one of the things that that board
25
    does is we talk about mental health, substance abuse,
```

   and once you're in that frame, you're going to need
   Housing, you're going to need healthcare. So it may
3
   be that one organization is focused on health, but a
   part of a person being healthy is that they need
5
   somewhere to stay and they need treatment for other
   things. And so it may not be their primary focus, but
   they are working with other organizations. So we can
   ask staff to kind of give you all a better explanation
   of what these entities do and if they have any
10
    collaborations with other organizations that may fit
11
    that. I know that South Florida Behavioral Health
12
    Network is doing a lot. It is for Dade and Monroe
13
    Counties, the managing entity designated, you know,
14
    build the DCF, so it may be involved with a number of
15
    other things that may fit this.
16
       MR. BAGNER: I want to have the copy of the
17
    language in the statute beyond saying cross-system
18
    planning for health and social services.
19
       MR. HOFFMAN: That is the actual language.
20
       MR. BAGNER: That is the actual language? And
21
    It's just that?
22
       MR. HOFFMAN: Local alliance or coalition
23
    engagement cross-system planning for health and social
24
    services delivery in the county.
25
       MR. BAGNER: I think the history provides more
```

   depth into what we're looking for. If you just base
   if on this language, I think we could probably argue
3
   that several organizations could fit that language.
4
       MR. HAJ: We can prepare information on the five
5
   that we selected and bring it back February, next
   meeting.
6

       MR. BAGNER: And I would recommend, too, I'm
   durious on the thoughts of this, but in terms of, you
   know, it's says for health service delivery,
10
    specifically, I think that is something we're lacking
11
    as a Board. We've had a few physicians come and go.
12
     don't think we have any current physicians on the
13
    Board, so that is something to think about. If beyond
14
    these, if there are other -- I think if it fits health
15
    delivery, health services delivery, so we could maybe
16
    think more broadly. I'm curious on other thoughts.
17
    That would be the first thing that popped into my
18
    mind.
19
       MS. DONWORTH: I think if you took the definition
20
    apart, so does it need to be a local alliance or
21
    coalition, number one, because that knocks out some
22
    things. Does it need to be involved in cross-system
23
    planning, because that might knock out some. You know
24
    what I mean? Like each term more narrowly defines
25
    what it is that fits.

       MR. HAJ: Well, that was our difficulty.
2
       MS. DONWORTH: So what's the most important
   thing?
3
4
       MR. BAGNER: But it sounds like the priority is
5
   to fill it and try to make it fit the language as much
   as we can while we consider amending the statute.

       Folks agree?
8
       Any other -- we're getting ready to start our
   Board meeting, so any other business?
10
       MR. PRESCOTT: Can I just bring this up, it's not
11
    on the agenda or anything? I participated in some of
12
    bur meetings where I've listened to people speak to
13
    and about the attorneys for The Children's Trust and
14
    the tone and tenor sometimes really gets to me. And I
15
    know I've spoken to you off record after the hearings
16
    and I've thanked you both for the way you've conducted
17
    yourselves, that you didn't respond. And I want to
18
    thank you for your professionalism and I thank you for
19
    the work that you do on behalf of the Trust and giving
20
    us the information that we need although everybody
21
    doesn't understand it and everybody is not willing to
22
    accept it. I do. And I thank you. And I'm just
23
    telling the Board, I don't know how much I can take
24
    when they're aligned like that again. I don't think
25
     'll be able to sit there and take it. Because they
```

```
won't say it, somebody has to say it for them. And I
1
   think I'm going to have to take that mantle because I
   know the job that they do and I know why they do what
3
4 they do. So I can't sit back and allow people to use
5
   the tone and tenor that they've been taking.
6
      MS. GRAVES: Thank you, I appreciate that.
7
      MR. BAGNER: Thank you, Judge.
8
      Any other business?
9
      With that, we'll adjourn and go into our Board
10
    meeting.
